DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. What extraordinary graces are available on Divine Mercy Sunday?

A. Our Lord revealed to St. Faustina His desire to literally flood us with His graces on that day. He told her: **On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. The soul that will go to Confession [beforehand] and receive Holy Communion [on that day] shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment** (*Diary* 699).

The theologian who examined St. Faustina's writings for the Holy See, Rev. Ignacy Rozycki, explained that this is the promise of a *complete renewal of baptismal grace*, and in that sense like a "second Baptism" (in much the same way that St. Catherine of Siena called sacramental Confession, undertaken out of true love of God, an "ongoing Baptism") (*The Dialogue*, no. 75).

The extraordinary graces promised to the faithful by our Lord Himself through St. Faustina should not be confused with the plenary indulgence granted by Pope John Paul II for the devout observance of the Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday). The Decree of the Holy See offers: "A plenary indulgence, granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer for the intentions of Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honour of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in You!)"

Q. How can I receive extraordinary graces on Divine Mercy Sunday?

A. In order to receive the extraordinary graces, you should prepare by making a good Confession, so that you can receive Holy Communion in a state of grace on Divine Mercy Sunday. In addition, Our Lord asked St. Faustina to be sure to perform acts of mercy: **Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be acts of mercy** (*Diary* 742). Our Lord also requested that the Image of The Divine Mercy be solemnly venerated on that day. **I want the image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it** (*Diary* 341).

Q. Can I receive Holy Communion on Mercy Sunday and offer those graces for someone else, living or deceased?

A. Our Lord's promise to grant complete forgiveness of sins and punishment on the Feast of Mercy is given to those who accept His invitation to come to the Fountain of Life. These graces are for ourselves.

I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy (*Diary* 1109). **Whoever approaches the Fount of Life on this day will be granted complete remission of sins**

and punishment (*Diary* 300). **The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment** (*Diary* 699).

However, given the extraordinary graces that the person receives from Holy Communion on Mercy Sunday namely, the complete renewal of baptismal grace the time after that Communion is an excellent time for the communicant to intercede for loved ones on earth, and to begin to undertake indulgenced works, as established by the Church, for the sake of the souls in purgatory.

In fact, Pope John Paul II granted a plenary indulgence for special devotions to The Divine Mercy on Divine Mercy Sunday, and these indulgences can be obtained for the suffering souls in purgatory.

Q. I am Catholic, but I cannot receive Holy Communion because I'm divorced and remarried outside the Catholic Church. Can I receive the graces of Divine Mercy Sunday?

A. If at present you cannot generally receive the Sacraments in the Catholic Church because of your marital circumstances, you would also not be permitted to receive Holy Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday until you rectify your situation through the pastoral offices of the Church.

Our Lord said to St. Faustina: **The graces of My mercy are drawn by means of one vessel only, and that is trust. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive. Souls that trust boundlessly are a great comfort to Me, because I pour all the treasures of My graces into them. I rejoice that they ask for much, because it is My desire to give much, very much** (*Diary* 1578).

With this in mind, you can participate in the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday by making a Spiritual Communion, with great trust. God will give you all the graces that He sees that you need because of your great trust.

The Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception will have a **special celebration** of Divine Mercy Sunday on April 28th from 2:45 PM to 5:00 PM. We will have Confessions* available, Blessing and Veneration of the Image, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Chaplet of Divine Mercy, Prayers and Hymns, Eucharistic Adoration, Vespers and Benediction. It does not include Mass, so you still need to attend Mass and receive Holy Communion this weekend in order to receive the extraordinary graces of Divine Mercy Sunday. High Mass in Extraordinary Form immediately follows the celebration at 5:00 PM.



*Those who already went to Confession should make room for others. The Church allows Confession up to **20 days** before or after Divine Mercy Sunday, as long as Holy Communion is received in the state of grace on the feast itself.

An Announcement from Bishop Glen John Provost

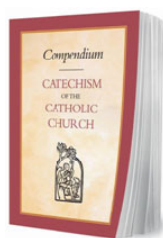

SESQUICENTENNIAL 1869—2019

As part of our sesquicentennial celebration we will be highlighting interesting facts in each bulletin about our history, titled:

DID YOU KNOW???? Part 17

Hubert Cramers was born September 3, 1875 in the village of Thorn, Holland, the youngest of nine children. The family was rich in vocations: one sister became a Franciscan nun, three nephews were ordained priests, and two other members of the family became lay brothers. He began his seminary studies in Weert in the Diocese of Roermond (Netherlands) and it was during this time he answered an appeal for volunteers to work in the Diocese of New Orleans. He then entered the American College at Louvain, Belgium to complete the four-year theological course of study and was ordained on June 29, 1898. That same year he came to the United States and assumed responsibility for the church at Houma at age 23. Two years later he was sent to Cameron. After two years there, Father Cramers was sent to Immaculate Conception at age 27.



To celebrate the 25th anniversary of the publication of the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), we will present questions taken from the Compendium, a faithful and sure synthesis of the Catechism in clear and concise format:

What is the value of private revelations?

While not belonging to the deposit of faith, private revelations may help a person to live the faith as long as they lead us to Christ. The Magisterium of the Church, which has the duty of evaluating such private revelations, cannot accept those which claim to surpass or correct that definitive Revelation which is Christ.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

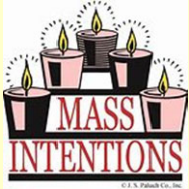
