

## 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Social Studies – St. Joseph Catholic School

*Social Studies is the coordinated, systematic, and integrated study of society which provides for the teaching and learning of civic competence and social understanding. Its primary purpose is to enable young people to develop life-long ability to make informed and reasoned decisions for the public good as citizens of a culturally diverse, democratic society in an interdependent world. (NCSS)*

### General Course Description:

This class is part of a two-year study of world studies with a major focus on world geography, culture, and history. It is divided into Western World Studies and Eastern World Studies, although there is some overlap due to the nature of World Studies. In World Studies, students will learn basic geography skills such as map reading, interpreting thematic maps (physical feature, climate, vegetation, economic activity, and population density) and the culture and history of the peoples who inhabit our world. Emphasis is on critical thinking, cultural diversity, current events, and writing in social sciences. In the first year what is covered is the study of geography and skill building, North America (Canada and the United States of America), Latin America (Mexico, Central America, South America and the Caribbean nations), and the beginning of Europe and Russia.

### Standards Used:

The standards from the National Council of Social Sciences along with the Michigan State Standards for social studies are used.

- Develop skills in identifying reliable sources, primary sources, and secondary sources
- Develop an ability to make informed and reasoned decisions and opinions
- Research and create related projects using a variety of methods
