

Shelter

The cost of living in NJ is one of the highest in the nation, and the challenges a single parent faces can seem insurmountable. Naomi's Way is a source of hope to the residents that live there. Located in New Brunswick, Naomi's Way offers support to homeless mothers who are employed or engaged in job training.

A resident would have to make \$28.04 per hour to afford a two-bedroom apartment in Middlesex County, more than three times the minimum wage in New Jersey. Naomi's Way provides families with resources and the gifts of time and living space until they can afford to live in their own apartment.



In 2015, 9765 days of care were provided at Naomi's Way to 61 individuals in 24 families.

three school aged boys who worked three jobs when she entered the shelter, unable to maintain her housing. After entering Naomi's Way, Susan continued to work and save money. While in residence, Susan was provided with case management and life skills training. Her boys excelled academically and were school athletes, the oldest in college and the next on his way. Thanks to Naomi's Way, Susan was able to move into her own apartment and her family continues to be stably housed.

MARIA was employed, but came to Naomi's Way due to being displaced from her home while fleeing domestic violence with her daughter. Over the course of a year, Maria saved enough money to move into her own apartment. Having succeeded, Maria returns to Naomi's Way as a motivational speaker, providing hope and inspiration to others who can benefit from her experience and success.



Over 20 Catholic Charities programs are available to provide short term assistance that lead to self-sufficiency, including the Ozanam Family Shelter in Edison, and the Ozanam Inn, a men's shelter. Last year, 215 shelter residents transitioned to stable housing and an improved quality of life.

DON was hungry, frightened and alone; he was in a place of despair. But through the services of Catholic Charities, he found more than a meal and a bed, Don found HOPE.

Meeting Basic Needs



More than 46 million Americans live in poverty, and almost one million of them live right here in New Jersey. Because making "ends meet" continues to be a struggle for residents in the Diocese of Metuchen, providing a safety net for the poor and vulnerable remains a major focus of the work of Catholic Charities.

The Catholic Charities Social Service Center opened in a new location in 2015. The new location, at 387 South Main Street in Phillipsburg, is owned by Catholic Charities and brings together its food pantry and thrift shop in one building. The services, previously located in separate rented spaces, have been serving Warren County since 1982.

The food pantry stocks grains, vegetables, fruits, dairy, and protein products. Additionally, through collaborative efforts with local senior citizen complexes, goods are delivered on a quarterly schedule. Case management is offered to people in need of encouragement, information, referral and advocacy services. Discounted goods sold at the thrift store help residents stretch their budgets.

Staffed largely by volunteers, and supplemented by churches, organizations, and individuals who contribute in-kind donations, the Social Service Center responded to more than 11,000 requests for food and clothing in Warren County in 2015.

TREE OF HOPE

Addiction has no boundaries and can affect anyone, regardless of age, race, religion or economic status. The programs in the Addiction Services Area serve adult individuals, families and adolescents who are struggling to overcome their addictions, providing hope to each individual as they reach for their goals in relation to themselves, their families and their recovery.

Catholic Charities' East Brunswick Family Service Office proudly accepted the Tree of Hope award in 2015 from the National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence of Middlesex County, and the spotlight it shines on addiction. The "Tree of Hope" is awarded annually to an organization that promotes recovery from addiction.

At the ceremony, Catherine shared her story, "I don't know where I would be today without Emma and Catholic Charities. Emma has taught me so much about addiction, and also about myself. She's shown me hope. Through this program and AA, I have my family back in my life. I'm working on getting my child back in my life; I have a job that I show up for... that at one time I would never have been able to do."

In addition to addiction services, Catholic Charities' East Brunswick Family Service Center offers general counseling, bilingual counseling, anger management counseling and services to persons in the community with serious and persistent mental illness. *The East Brunswick Family Service Office provided over 10,000 hours of service to 698 clients in 2015.*

YOUTH PARTIAL CARE

Adolescence is a vulnerable stage of human development. Today's youth are growing up in troubled times with deeply troubling realities: drugs, gangs, violence, illiteracy, abuse and disease. There has never been so much freedom, so much information, or so much danger. Catholic Charities, Diocese of Metuchen recognizes the dangers and works to overcome these realities.

The Youth Partial Care (YPC) Program provides group counseling to youth and adolescents who are experiencing serious emotional, behavioral, and/or psychiatric challenges. Youth and adolescents learn to improve social skills, enhance coping strategies for managing difficult situations and are given the opportunity to bond with other youth and adolescents who understand their challenges.



68 children received 6424 hours of services from the Youth Partial Care program in 2015.

Stories of hope

MICHAEL came to the Youth Partial Care program after a long tour of programs. He was fighting a lot with his mom at home, the fights having to do with a trauma that happened to him as a child from which he had not recovered. Being at YPC gave Michael the opportunity to not only work with a therapist, but to talk with peers his age who could understand what Michael was going through. Michael was able to help others while at the same time helping himself. Last year Michael visited the YPC program to share his story as a senior in high school who was celebrating his one year anniversary being part of his local rescue squad.

Health, Wellness & Advocacy In Child Care

YOUTH ENRICHMENT SERVICES & SCHOOL AGE CHILD CARE

Health and wellness is a focus of all Catholic Charities programs; the Youth Enrichment Services (YES) Program is no exception. YES achieved success in 2015 in promoting the importance of a healthy lifestyle among its clients and community members. As a participant in the Shaping NJ initiative, (funded by The NJ Department of Health, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, NJ YMCA



State Alliance, Partners for Health and Atlantic Health System), the YES program provided a wealth of resources, information, events and activities to the families and children they serve at the YES program in Middlesex County.

A series of monthly workshops about health and nutrition, field trips and hands on experiences, such as gardening, cooking and exercising were all part of a community collaboration that culminated in a Healthy Families, Healthy Community Fair. These activities will have continuing effects that promote lifestyle changes and place importance on access to healthy food and opportunities for routine physical activity. The YES Program will continue to partner with local community organizations to educate families and the community about health, nutrition, and obesity prevention.

Catholic Charities School Age Programs participated in Lights on Afterschool, as it does each year, a nationwide event that celebrates afterschool programs and their important role in the lives of children, families and communities. The event sends a strong message that millions more children need quality afterschool programs.

Affordable quality child care is one of the services most frequently requested by the clients of Catholic Charities, Diocese of Metuchen. Catholic Charities responds with expertise and compassion, providing quality care, empowerment and education to the community to adopt a healthier lifestyle. Overall, 1530 children were enrolled in Catholic Charities Child Care Programs, including 190 in preschool, 935 in school age child care and 405 in summer camp programs.

HOPE IN ACTION

Unity Square, a social justice initiative of Catholic Charities continues to empower community members and catalyze change in the poorest residential neighborhood of New Brunswick, NJ. In so doing, Unity Square addresses a diverse set of issues, including economic development, employment, civic participation, crime and safety, immigrants' rights, and tenants' rights.

More than a year ago, in response to the requests of its neighborhood residents, Unity Square staff and resident leaders gave Mayor Jim Cahill of New Brunswick input on the original framework of an ordinance that would require paid sick leave for the Unity Square community. These efforts paid off!



In 2015, the city of New Brunswick became the eleventh municipality in New Jersey to mandate paid sick leave, and the first city in the state to specify that this short-term leave may also be used for purposes related to the effects of domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking.




