#### THE MARCH FOR LIFE AND THE RELIGION OF ABORTION

The hierarchy (Planned Parenthood), the acolytes (clinic workers), the congregation (supporters) and the ministers were all at the abortion temple that day worshipping the god of abortion. And the demons were so pleased.

St. Paul reminds us in Ephesians 6 that our battle is not against flesh and blood. It is against the principalities and powers of this world of darkness. The darkness is spreading, but the Light of Christ shines forth in all those wonderful kids and their parents that showed the world that life will win in the end.

## COLUMBUS CLUB CORP. REPORTING FOR FINANCIAL FOR 2007

Enclosed in this Knight Life is the financial report for 2007 which shows the actual income and expenses versus the 2007 budget. If there are any questions regarding this report, please call us or come to the Board meeting on Tuesday, March 25, 2008 at 7:00 PM in the Council Home or the next joint meeting on April 3, 2008 in the Main Hall at 7:30 PM.

In summary, we are very proud of the Corporations success in 2007 as we strive to move forward and leave ourselves farther up the sand on the beach each and every year. It was a growing year for the Corporation in many areas. Let's start with personnel. We finally hired a new General Manager, Jesse Corning, who started in mid April and our new Chef, Ernest Todd started in January. We completed the approved Capital improvements. Other replacements were done as well such as the loading dock door assembly with an entirely new storefront look, new flat screens in the CH and the pool lounge, completed concrete work in front of the MH entrance and along with railings, among others.

We (meaning the BOD and the staff) also addressed the areas where income was down for 2006. We now feel that we have procedures, accountability, and marketing techniques in place for a very efficient operation of the MH, CH, camp and pool.

The 2007 actual vs. 2007 Budget shows net cash flow was more than budgeted by about \$17,000. Income was up 12%. However expenses were up vs. budget by 19%. This was do for two reasons (1) - we had a special one-time large depreciation write-off and (2)- salaries increased as we finally had a full time GM and Chef in 2007.

From a cash flow perspective, 2007 was about \$47,000 greater than 2006. We spent \$37,000 for replacement of fixed equipment and other purchases in 2007 that gets recorded as Fixed Assets but is not reflected in profit/loss statement.

Also enclosed in this Knight Life is the financial comparison report going back to 2001 through 2007 which shows the actual income and expenses year-by-year.

We are looking very optimistically at the year 2008 as we move into the game with a lot of seasoned talented players on our team with the support of several key contractors. Our staff has our full support and confidence for the 2008 season. We are here as a BOD to oversee the process, not manage the people.

Lastly, I want to thank the Board of Directors and Committee Chairman's for all the time, effort and enthusiasm put forth as you did all of the above plus pull off the Capital Improvements Project and the Capital Campaign program (special thanks to Jim Savarese as Chairman!). Thank you!!!
