Meditations on Holy Mass

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord Sixth Sunday of Lent (C)

First reading: Isaiah 50.4-7 CCC 141; 713

I shall not hide my face from insult and spitting. I know that I shall not be put to shame.

Second reading: Philippians 2.6-11 CCC 1850; 2641, 2667
Jesus humbled himself. Therefore, God highly exalted him.

Gospel: Luke 22.14-23.56 CCC 1130; 1365; 2600; 2605; 2616, 2266

The passion of our Lord Jesus Christ

In the *first reading* the prophet announces that the Christ, God's obedient Servant, is to suffer. This is divine, active suffering, willingly undertaken out of love for us, in order to expiate our human sins. In the *Gospel*, St. Luke writes, "Then an angel from heaven appeared to Jesus and gave him strength." In this we see the humility of God. All powerful himself, he accepts the help of a creature. Let us look to conquer sinful pride that relies on itself. In the *second reading*, St. Paul teaches that, through the humility of the Saviour's Incarnation, Jesus, our Lord, has joined human nature to God's own life. Jesus is Lord of all creation. He offers us eternal life. Let us be humble and accept it.

Before Mass: The whole group of disciples joyfully began to praise God at the top of their voices. They cried out, "Blessings on the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest heavens!" (*Lauds*)

After Mass: "I tell you, these words of Scripture have to be fulfilled in me: 'He let himself be taken for a criminal.' Yes, what Scripture says about me is even now reaching its fulfillment." (*Vespers*)

Message from the Rector

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord begins Holy Week, the last days of Lent and the beginning of the Easter Triduum. The Church celebrates the mysteries of salvation accomplished by Christ in the last days of his life on earth, beginning with his messianic entrance into the Holy City, Jerusalem. Since 1985 during the pontificate of Saint John Paul II, the Church has also observed World Day of Youth on Palm Sunday. As is customary, Pope Francis will welcome delegations of young people for the Palm Sunday celebration in St. Peter's Square. Due to constraints of time and place, our Sunday Masses will alternate between the Solemn Entrance and the Simple Entrance for Palm Sunday, as permitted by the liturgy. The story of the Passion of the Lord according to St. Luke is the Gospel text that is proclaimed, read in parts.

The Paschal fast should be observed everywhere on Good Friday and continued, where possible, on Holy Saturday. In reading and hearing the Passion narratives, given the rise of anti-Semitism – notably in Europe – it is important for us to remember that when the evangelist Saint John refers to “the Jews”, the Church teaches that he is not saying that all Jews, either of Jesus’ time or our time, are responsible for his death. As Christians, we must remember that “Christ, out of infinite love, freely underwent suffering and death because of the sins of all people, so that all might attain salvation.” (Ordo pages 189-190).

Masses and confessions will be at the regular times on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week. The celebration of the Easter Triduum opens with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Thursday, reaches its climax in the Easter Vigil when the catechumens will be baptized and the candidates welcomed into full communion with the Church, and closes with the liturgies of Easter Sunday. As the schedule – including the time of opening of our church – will change for the Easter Triduum, please consult the schedule, which is available elsewhere in the bulletin, as well as on the printed cards available at the entrances. Again this year, Morning Prayer will be celebrated at 8:30 AM on Thursday, Friday and Saturday.
