STEWARDSHIP: DISCIPLESHIP IN ACTION

Stewardship is not a sometimes event but the response to discipleship in our Lord, Jesus Christ. It is an outward sign of our conversion of heart, a way of giving thanks to God for His grace and gifts, and placing our blessing at the disposal of the greater Church. You are not asked to "give till it hurts" but to give until you are satisfied that you are supporting your local church-home and helping those in need around you.

Stewardship requires three avenues of commitment: **time**, **talent**, and **treasure**. We give of our **talents**, gifts and abilities, as liturgical Ministers as catechists, and as craftsmen and artists; we give of our **time** in organizations that support the church, that do outreach to the needy, as classroom aides, and as volunteers; and we give of our treasure by tithing to support our church community and in charitable giving.

Tithing means giving 10% of our income in support of your church community, always aware that "bread cast upon waters" comes back many fold.

HISTORY OF THE CHURCH



The conception of St. Michael the Archangel Catholic Church began in the late 1970's when Fr. John Brennan, Pastor of Immaculate Conception Church, saw a an increasing need for a new parish to meet the growing Catholic population in the southern region of Grand Prairie.

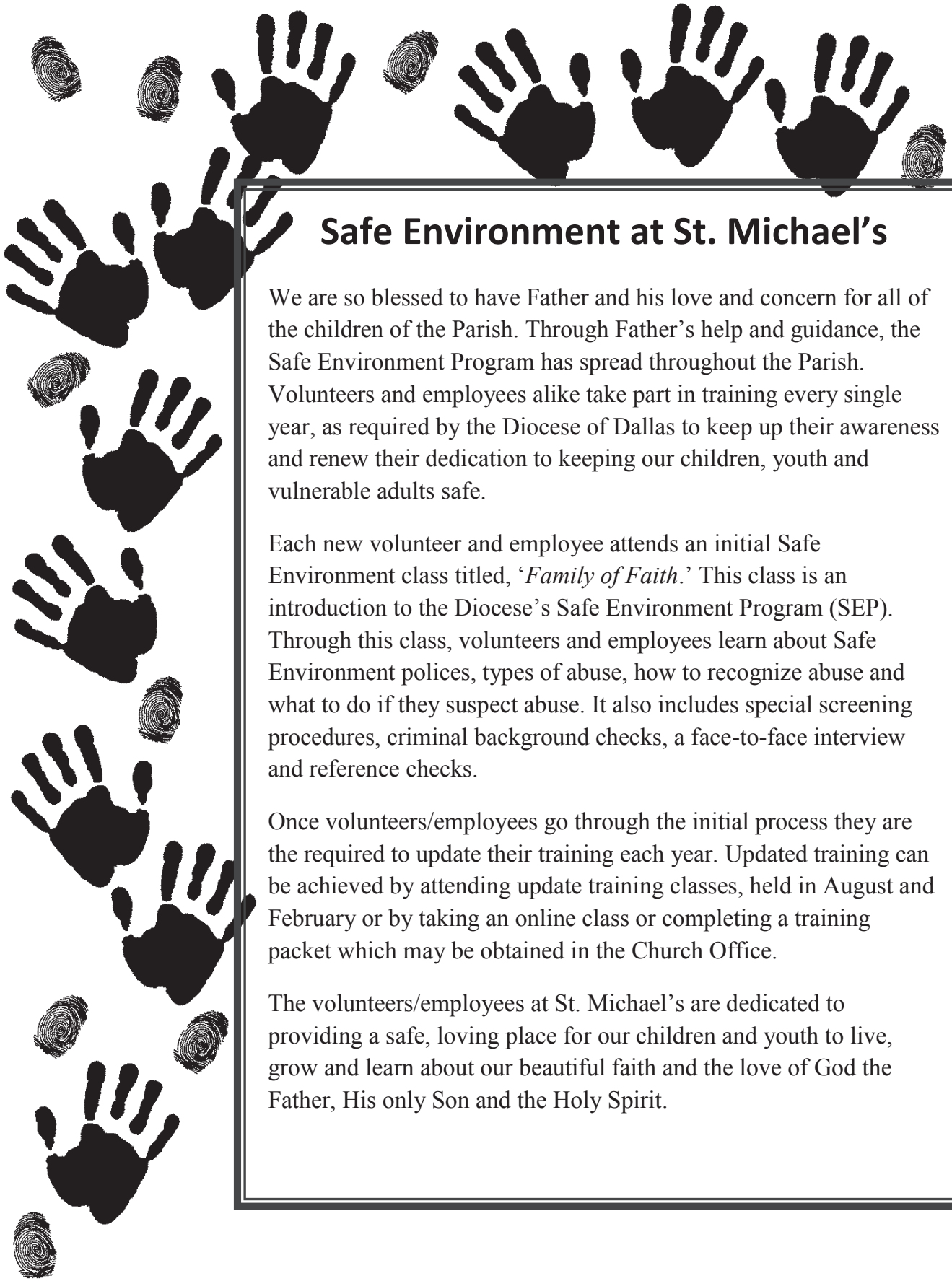
In early 1984, representatives met with the Pastor of Immaculate Conception to establish a Mission in south Grand Prairie. On the last Sunday of March, the first Mass was celebrated at Zavala Elementary School with 314 attending.

Fr. John Fowler was appointed the first Pastor of St. Michael the Archangel by Bishop Thomas Tschoepe on June 14, 1985, and ground was broken for the existing church complex on June 22, 1986, one year later. The new Church complex was dedicated on December 5, 1987.

In June of 1992 Fr. Paul Weinberger replaced Fr. Fowler in administering to the needs of the St. Michael family. In September of that same year Fr. Rick Tullius became the Pastor. Fr. Tullius served until January 1997 when Fr. Danilo Ramos replaced him. In September of 1997 Fr. Joseph Lee replaced Fr. Ramos. Fr. Clifford Smith came to St. Michael in May 1999, he served as administrator. Fr. Clifford Smith was installed as

Pastor by Bishop Charles Grahmann on June 26, 2000. Fr. Andrew Semler came to St. Michael in September 2005 he served as administrator. Fr. Andrew Semler was installed as Pastor by Bishop Charles Grahmann on October 13, 2006. Fr. "Joseph" Hoa Duc Trinh was appointed Pastoral Administrator in January 2009. Former Bishop Kevin Farrell appointed Fr. Joseph to Pastor August 17, 2015.

As of January 2017, St. Michael the Archangel has grown from a few hundred individuals to over 1,846 families. From diverse cultures, languages and countries we have been called together into a local Church community that has roots worldwide. Presently an average of 2,187 attend the Saturday night Vigil and four Mass celebrations each Sunday. Our parishioners travel from 26 different cities located within the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex for Mass each Sunday. We welcome all our sisters and brothers who are seeking to find a church home.



Safe Environment at St. Michael's

We are so blessed to have Father and his love and concern for all of the children of the Parish. Through Father's help and guidance, the Safe Environment Program has spread throughout the Parish. Volunteers and employees alike take part in training every single year, as required by the Diocese of Dallas to keep up their awareness and renew their dedication to keeping our children, youth and vulnerable adults safe.

Each new volunteer and employee attends an initial Safe Environment class titled, '*Family of Faith.*' This class is an introduction to the Diocese's Safe Environment Program (SEP). Through this class, volunteers and employees learn about Safe Environment polices, types of abuse, how to recognize abuse and what to do if they suspect abuse. It also includes special screening procedures, criminal background checks, a face-to-face interview and reference checks.

Once volunteers/employees go through the initial process they are the required to update their training each year. Updated training can be achieved by attending update training classes, held in August and February or by taking an online class or completing a training packet which may be obtained in the Church Office.

The volunteers/employees at St. Michael's are dedicated to providing a safe, loving place for our children and youth to live, grow and learn about our beautiful faith and the love of God the Father, His only Son and the Holy Spirit.

Aims and Methods of the Scouting Program

The Scouting program has three specific objectives, commonly referred to as the "Aims of Scouting." They are character development, citizenship training, and personal fitness.

The methods by which the aims are achieved are listed below in random order to emphasize the equal importance of each.

Ideals

The ideals of Boy Scouting are spelled out in the Scout Oath, the Scout Law, the Scout motto, and the Scout slogan. The Boy Scout measures himself against these ideals and continually tries to improve. The goals are high, and as he reaches for them, he has some control over what and who he becomes..

Outdoor Programs

Boy Scouting is designed to take place outdoors. It is in the outdoor setting that Scouts share responsibilities and learn to live with one another. In the outdoors the skills and activities practiced at troop meetings come alive with purpose. Being close to nature helps Boy Scouts gain an appreciation for the beauty of the world around us. The outdoors is the laboratory in which Boy Scouts learn ecology and practice conservation of nature's resources.

Advancement

Boy Scouting provides a series of surmountable obstacles and steps in overcoming them through the advancement method. The Boy Scout plans his advancement and progresses at his own pace as he meets each challenge. The Boy Scout is rewarded for each achievement, which helps him gain self-confidence. The steps in the advancement system help a Boy Scout grow in self-reliance and in the ability to help others.

Personal Growth

As Boy Scouts plan their activities and progress toward their goals, they experience personal growth. The Good Turn concept is a major part of the personal growth method of Boy Scouting. Boys grow as they participate in community service projects and do Good Turns for others. Probably no device is as successful in developing a basis for personal growth as the daily Good Turn. The religious emblems program also is a large part of the personal growth method. Frequent personal conferences with his Scoutmaster help each Boy Scout to determine his growth toward Scouting's aims.

Leadership Development

The Boy Scout program encourages boys to learn and practice leadership skills. Every Boy Scout has the opportunity to participate in both shared and total leadership situations. Understanding the concepts of leadership helps a boy accept the leadership role of others and guides him toward the citizenship aim of Scouting.

Uniform

Boy Scouts is an action program, and wearing the uniform is an action that shows each Boy Scout's commitment to the aims and purposes of Scouting. The uniform gives the Boy Scout identity in a world brotherhood of youth who believe in the same ideals. The uniform is practical attire for Boy Scout activities and provides a way for Boy Scouts to wear the badges that show what they have accomplished.

Volunteer Scouts

Thousands of volunteer leaders, both men and women, are involved in the Boy Scouting program. They serve in a variety of jobs--everything from unit leaders to chairmen of troop committees, committee members, merit badge counselors, and chartered organization representatives.

Like other phases of the program, Boy Scouting is made available to community organizations having similar interests and goals. Chartered organizations include professional organizations; governmental bodies; and religious, educational, civic, fraternal, business, labor, and citizens' groups. Each organization appoints one of its members as the chartered organization representative. The organization is responsible for leadership, the meeting place, and support for troop activities.

Christ Renews His Parish



Christ Renews His Parish (CRHP) is a process designed to bring members of the Parish together in Christ. All of our commitments, including our commitments to Christ, need continued renewal if we are to be faithful. CRHP is an effective spiritual process, which calls together the members of the parish – priests, religious and laity – in order to experience personal conversion and Christian community in the environment of our own Parish.

We hold four Renewal Weekends each year, 2 for the men of our parish and 2 for the women of our parish. You must be 19 years or older to attend this spirit filled weekend of prayer and enlightenment. There is no cost to attend these weekends. These renewal weekends are hosted by your fellow parishioners who are willing to share their time and journey with you. The only thing we ask is that you come with an open heart and mind to reignite the fire God has placed in your heart.

Many of our parishioners feel closer to God and have a better understanding of why God chose them to be on their journey. On top of that you meet new people and build lasting relationships with people in our own community that you might not have had the chance to meet otherwise.

Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.)



The RCIA is a process to welcome members into full initiation and communion with the Catholic Church. It's a journey of conversion and transformation. RCIA is for the unbaptized adult, the baptized adult that is from another Christian tradition, or a baptized Catholic Adult who is un-catechized and has not celebrated the sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation. The RCIA process is also for children who are 7 years and older who have not been baptized or were baptized in another Christian tradition. These sessions are for child and parents.

Convalidation

A process for having a civil marriage or a marriage which took place in another Christian Church, recognized and blessed by the Catholic Church. Couples must be registered members of a parish and make an appointment with the Administrative Assistant at least 6 months prior to convalidation ceremony. Recently issued copies of baptism certificates are required.

Faith Formation



Catechesis is an esteemed term in Christian tradition. Its purpose is to make a person's faith become living, conscious, and active, through the light of instruction. Faith Formation is a process that begins in the early years of one's life and continues to be a life long journey.

The formative school years of our children and teens are the nurturing years of their faith formation. It does not occur in a year or two but is a gradual process that continues throughout their formative school years that will lead them toward an adult Catholic understanding.

Open registration for Kindergarten through High School, takes place in Mid August, dates and times will be published in the parish bulletin. To avoid being placed on a waiting list you must be a registered parishioner three months prior to registration. Schedules of class times and fees will be posted in the parish bulletin prior to open registration.

Classes are held September through May, with holidays and Holy Days observed throughout the year. Every effort is made to limit classes to 21 children to maximize attention and benefit. Activities are planned to coincide with religious holidays for greater learning experience and to instill values for practicing our Catholic faith everyday with our families and community

Infant/Child Baptisms

In order to baptize a child [under 7 years of age] the Parish requirements for parents and godparents: they must be practicing members of a Catholic Church, they both are required to attend a baptism class, these are offered one Saturday of each month, please register in advance for class. Godparents must be active practicing Catholics, be at least 16 years of age, and must be Baptized, Confirmed and have received First Holy Communion, and if married they must be married in the Catholic Church. They must be members of the Church and receiving sacraments. There must be a least one sponsor, but if there are two, one must be a male and the other a female. If the godparent is not a registered member of St. Michael's Parish a letter verifying membership and active participation in the sacraments must be issued by their home parish. All baptisms are celebrated in the context of the Mass.

Preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage

Couples must be registered members of a parish and make an appointment with Administrative Assistant at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. The couple must bring to their appointment recently issued copies of their baptism certificate with notations.



Two marriage preparation programs are required and are arranged through the Parish Office and the Diocesan Office. The date must be scheduled through the Parish Office after all paperwork is received. There is a fee of \$350 this includes the rental of the Church and Wedding coordinator, arrangements can be made to pay the fee in payments, the balance to be paid 30 days prior to the ceremony. Fees do not include Flowers, Music, or Stipends.

Quince Años Celebration



The Quinceañera celebration is a coming of age celebration among Hispanics and Latinos. It is a celebration of thanksgiving for the gift of life. The young lady or young man is presented to the church, just like Jesus was presented at the temple by Mary and Joseph.

The young person renews his/her baptismal vows and makes a commitment to follow the teachings of the church. In the Quinceañera prayer the young person gives thanks to God and asks the Virgin Mary for guidance.

My name is Nina Sanchez and I became the Quinceañera coordinator in 1997 when Fr. Danny Ramos asked me to help him. Fr. Clifford Smith was instrumental in developing some guidelines and a power point presentation used to teach the Quinceañera Classes. The Diocese of Dallas implemented this into the Quince-Anos Facilitator Manual in 2006.

The requirements to have a Quinceañera celebration are; The young person must be enrolled and attend Faith Formation classes, for two consecutive years with good attendance. The Quinceañera must also attend a class, which I teach. I work with the Quinceañera and the parents, informing them about the different reading that they have to choose from. The coordinator tells them which music, flowers and dress are appropriate for the church. My husband Tony and I take care of the rehearsal, and on the day of the Quinceañera my husband helps to set-up and prepares the altar for the priest, and also serves as usher.

The Tradition of the Quinceañera originated with the Maya and Aztecs. A male child was not considered a person until he reached the age of 15. At this age after going through some difficult training, he was presented with a coat of arms and a sword. In a special ceremony, he was presented before the tribal community of adults.

Likewise the female child was separated from the family and instructed on the responsibilities of a mother. At the age of 15, she was presented to the tribal community as a vital strength of the tribe, capable of gifting warriors.

With the Spanish conquest came the missionaries who instructed the tribes in the Catholic faith. As the number of converts grew, the mass became a part of the celebration. It became a celebration of thanksgiving.

Emperor Maximiliano and his wife Carlota introduced the waltz, formal dress and the formal dance to Mexican society. Thus this became a part of the Quinceanera celebration.

Many Hispanic families start saving for the Quinceanera celebration as soon as a daughter is born. Others ask family members and close friends to serve as "padrinos" or sponsors, who share in the cost of the celebration. The Quinceanera asks 14 close friends to serve as her "damas" or court of honor. These can be 14 girls or 7 girls and 7 boys. They represent the first 14 years of life. She as the Quinceanera represents her 15th.

The Quinceanera celebration is a time for the family, friends and the church community to support and encourage the young people to be involved in the life, mission and work of the church.

Wedding Coordinators

Couples for Christ Foundation for Family and Life (CFC FFL)

What is Couples for Christ Foundation for Family and Life (CFC FFL)?

CFC FFL is a Christian evangelistic and missionary community that aims to build the "church of the home" by bringing families to a living relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ.

It began in 1981 when 16 couples tried a new approach in living out their Christian life in an active and supportive relationship with one another. Eventually, it became a Christian family renewal program available to parishes and groups of married couples who wished to renew the power of the Holy Spirit among them through a series of weekly informal discussions of the gospel in a social setting

Why is such a ministry necessary?

It is God's plan that the family be the basic unit of society, such that the conditions of families determine the condition of society. However, there are many forces in the world today that would, wittingly, or unwittingly, destroy the very foundation of the family. CFC FFL wants to bring God's strength and God's light to those who are struggling to be truly Christian families in the modern world.

CFC FFL carries out its mission focused on three objectives:

- a) Individual renewal
- b) Family renewal
- c) Church renewal

Who can become members of CFC FFL?

Any validly married Christian couple can become members of CFC FFL. CFC FFL observes Catholic doctrines, but is open to membership to all Christians of other denominations.

How does a couple become members of CFC FFL?

Those who want to become members of CFC FFL go through a course that is called a Christian Life Seminar (CLS) a series of nine talks dealing with catechesis, divided into three modules of 3 talks each. Most sessions consist of a talk, a group discussion, and sometime for fellowship.

After the CLS, those who finish are invited to join CFC FFL. When they do, they are then made part of small cell group called a household. The household is composed of about four to six couples who meet weekly for encouragement and mutual support

in the Christian life, under the guidance of a household servant. The household is also the venue in which continuing formation teachings and bible studies are held.

Is CFC-FFL recognized by the Catholic Church?

Yes, CFC FFL is a servant and lay arm of the Roman Catholic Church in the work of evangelization, family renewal and the promotion and defense of life. Our founder Frank Padilla sits together with his wife Gerry, in the Pontifical Council of the Family.

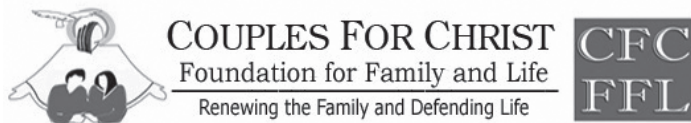
What benefits can a parish derive in having CFC FFL?

Couples are renewed and strengthened in their Christian lives. Strong couples make for strong families who in turn become available to serve Catholic parishes. CFC FFL members integrate themselves into the parish performing as members of different ministries in the church

CFC FFL also has catechesis programs for the different members of the family other than couples. Since 1993, CFC FFL has the ministries for kids, youth, singles, and widows/ separated widowers/ separated. CFC FFL has a "womb-to-tomb" ministry. CFC FFL also engages in the social dimension of the gospel. We have our work with the poor, work for the justice and work for life.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

What is an Extraordinary Minister of Communion?

A Communion Minister is a lay person who assists the ordained ministers in the distribution of the Body and Blood of Christ at Masses or Communion Services, and brings the Blessed Sacrament to the home bound, the hospitalized, and other parishioners who cannot join the Sunday Mass.



Is there Special Training to become an Extraordinary Minister of Communion?

Communion Ministers must attend a training session which is normally offered once or twice a year. Procedures are explained and questions are answered. Following training new ministers are commissioned at a Sunday Mass usually at the end August or beginning of September.

Requirements for Being an Extraordinary Minister

- You need to be at least 16 years of age
- You need to have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and First Communion.
- You need to be a registered member of St. Michael the Archangel Parish
- You need to have attended a Safe Environment Training

Session

- You must pass a background check and have a personal interview with the Safe Environment Coordinator
- You need to attend a training class for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion
- Follow the Diocese dress code

Lectors

In baptism, Christians have put on Christ and are anointed to share in His ministry as priest, prophet and king. The lector, in a special way, fulfills the ministry of prophecy by proclaiming the Word of God, Jesus Christ. In doing so, the lector makes Him present to the people of God in the liturgical assembly.

The lector proclaims the readings from Sacred Scripture, with the exception of the Gospel. He may also announce the intentions for the Prayer of the Faithful in the absence of a Deacon and, in the absence of a psalmist, proclaim the Psalm between the readings. Participants receive a workbook in the fall for the entire Liturgical year. This ministry is open to all confirmed parishioners 15 years or older with a love and reverence for the scriptures, good voice projection and reading abilities. Training takes place quarterly or scheduled as needed.

Pro-Life Committee

Our Pro-Life Committee has been active at St Michael’s for approximately 8 years now. Our function is to promote the church’s teachings that life is sacred and to spread the word that there are alternatives to unwanted pregnancy situations, rather than abortion. We support three women’s pregnancy resource centers in the Dallas Diocese.



One is in Grand Prairie, only ½ mile from this church. We do this through collection and delivery of baby clothing and food that our parishioners donate each week. We also ensure that training for Gabriel Angels and volunteer Sidewalk Counselors is accomplished. Prayer is our greatest strength against abortion. So the St. Michael’s Catholic Community is scheduled to pray in front of a nearby Planned Parenthood Clinic on the fourth Saturday of each month from 9 to 11 am. We invite, and urge you to join us for at least 1 hour of prayer at that site. Watch the bulletin for a reminder and directions. Bring the family and friends. Recently, the Catholic Pro Life Committee (CPLC) of Dallas began this ministry in the Spanish language also. The CPLC provides the training and necessary materials, in both languages, to all who want to help save lives. If you want to assist young women who need our help, we will ensure you are trained so you will be more effective and learn of all the resources available to help brothers and sisters in need of our help, advice and compassion. Currently, we meet on a quarterly basis in one of the classrooms and announce this in the Bulletin or contact all committee members. We want and need your help, but most importantly, those young women who find themselves in a crisis situation due to unexpected pregnancies are the ones who really need you. We are their source of information to alternatives, and help. With ours, and God’s help, we pray that they will choose life, rather than abortion, for their unborn child, their gift from God.

COMITÉ PRO-VIDA

Welcome Ministry

The Welcome Committee at St. Michael's was formed in 2008. The purpose of this ministry is to provide an opportunity for new parishioners to meet the parish priest, become familiar with their new church home, learn what services are offered and personally meet active members of their new faith community.



The committee coordinates Welcome Sessions every 2 months or as needed. On the day of the session, committee members greet the new families and arrange for them to sit together for the pre-determined church service. During Mass, each family is called to the front and presented with a gift. The priest then provides his blessing and invites the congregation to welcome the families with a warm round of applause.

After Mass, the new families are taken on a tour of the facilities which ends in Mazaika Hall, where refreshments are provided while representatives from different ministries give a very brief description of their organization's purpose and activities. The Welcome Session is informational only, as attendees are not asked to join any organizations. The intent is to let new members know what services are available to meet their needs or that they may be moved to join after prayerful consideration.

Our hope is that with these activities we can help families who join St. Michael's feel more comfortable, accepted, and spiritually engaged with their new church home.
