

# **We Meet Jesus in the Sacraments**

## **GRADE FIVE SCOPE AND SEQUENCE**

1. The sacrament of Christian initiation are Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist
  - a. In Baptism we are freed from sin and become children of God
    1. Baptism welcomes us into the Church
    2. Water is an important sign of Baptism
  - b. Confirmation leads us from Baptism to Eucharist
    1. In Confirmation we become more Christ-like
    2. Laying of hands and the anointing with Holy Chrism are signs important in Confirmation
    3. On Pentecost the Holy Spirit came to the disciples
    4. Know the gifts of the Holy Spirit
    5. Expand the idea of the Holy Trinity
  - c. In the Eucharist we celebrate and receive Jesus Christ
    1. The Breaking of the Bread is a sign of the Eucharist
    2. The Eucharist is a memorial, a meal and a sacrifice
2. The Sacraments of healing are Reconciliation and the Anointing of the Sick
  - a. Jesus forgives and strengthens us through the Sacrament of Reconciliation
    1. We trust in God's mercy and forgiveness
    2. Reconciliation strengthens our relationship with God
  - b. Jesus heals those who are sick
    1. Jesus' apostles healed the sick in his name
    2. Jesus is with us when we suffer
    3. We are called to care for the sick
    4. The Anointing of the Sick continues Jesus' message of healing
3. The sacraments of service are Holy Order and Matrimony
  - a. Holy Orders is a sacrament through which the Church continues the apostles' mission
    1. Laying on of hands and prayer of consecration are signs of Holy Orders
    2. Bishops, priests and deacons serve the Church in different ways
  - b. Marriage is a sacrament and a vocation
    1. A man and a women promise to always love and be true to one another
    2. The marriage covenant models Christ's love for his church
  - c. The laity shares in the mission to spread God's word
  - d. Evangelization is everyone's responsibility
  - e. The saints are models of how to live out God's message
  - f. When we serve others we give witness to Christ
4. The Mass has four main parts
  - a. The Introductory Rites bring the community together
  - b. During the Liturgy of the Word we listen to the word of God
  - c. At the Liturgy of the Eucharist we receive the Body and Blood of Christ
  - d. The Concluding Rites send us out into the community to be Christ's representatives
5. Sacramentals and special devotions are important to practice
  - a. Know the Holy Days of Obligation especially the Feast of the Immaculate Conception
  - b. Teach the mysteries of the Rosary
  - c. Explain the basis of Eucharistic Adoration
