Council May Make By-Laws

The Knights of Columbus Charter Constitution at Chapter XXVI, Sec. 241 allows subordinate councils to promulgate for their own government such by-laws, rules and regulations as they may find necessary for the proper conduct of their affairs provided they do not conflict with or are in opposition to or in any way impair the enforcement of the constitution, rules and regulations of the Supreme Council or Board of Directors of the Knights. The by-laws must also be approved by the Supreme Advocate.

In reviewing our By-Laws I note they were adopted in 2003 and approved by the Supreme Advocate in 2006. They are in need of tiding up. For example, Article V – the Balloting for Candidates. When did we last use a ballot box on a salutation table with membership advancing in single file depositing their ballots? Perhaps, if we currently perform a function differently, we need to update accordingly. The next question would be how often. Legally, a good rule of thumb would be to review every five years, ten at the longest. All of this, of course, begs for the formation of a committee to review the By-Laws (hopefully no less than three members, not including the Advocate who would also be a member of the committee, though not the leader) who would accept suggestions from the membership. The committee would then formulate recommendations which would be reviewed, and simplified to the extent permitted, by the Advocate before submitting the By-Laws to the Supreme Advocate. Would anyone care to step forward and lead this committee? It's your Council please step forward, and give us your time and expertise. Marriage and the Family

Not long ago we could define marriage as the unique union of one man and one woman. Today it is no exaggeration to say that the most common criticism leveled against those who hold to this classic time-honored definition of marriage is that they are being discriminatory. Their argument is that marriage is a human right and that it is unfair to exclude people from marriage simply because they want to marry someone of the same sex, or taking it one step further, multiple members. Words are frequently heard in media and pop venues about fairness, equality, rights, and non-discrimination. These are important principles and values for a society but the emphasis is misplaced. The Church's teaching on marriage upholds and enhances the dignity of men, women, and children.

There is nothing like marriage, the union of husband and wife. It serves a unique and irreplaceable social role, deserving the protection and privileges of the state. The rights of children to a mother and a father, the rights and responsibilities of husbands and wives, fathers and mothers, to each other and to the children they bring into the world. All of these are safeguarded by promoting and protecting the unique meaning of marriage.

As pointed out by Archbishop Joseph Kurtz of Louisville, Ky, president of the USCCB, "Just as Roe v. Wade did not settle the question of abortion over forty years ago, Obergefell v. Hodges does not settle the question of marriage today. Neither decision is rooted in the truth, and as a result, both will eventually fail. Today the Court is wrong again. It is profoundly immoral and unjust for the government to declare that two people of the same sex can constitute a marriage. ... Mandating marriage redefinition across the country is a tragic error that harms the common good and most vulnerable among us, especially children. The law has a duty to support every child's basic right to be raised, where possible, by his or her married mother and father in a stable home."

Pray American Catholics will listen and follow the Pope's message at the 8th **World Meeting of Families** in Philadelphia from September 22 through 25, 2015. The theme of this year's event is "**Love is Our Mission: The Family fully alive**". It will be a celebration of the family, the sanctuary of love and life.
