- ◇ Deposits to the credit of the council all funds received in an approved bank or other secure institution of deposit
- ◇ Pays to Supreme Secretary all moneys assessed against the council
- ◇ Pays orders Drawn on him which are signed by the Financial Secretary and countersigned by the Grand Knight.
- ◇ Keeps separate Accounts of the moneys placed in his hands by his council and plainly show at all times the amount of moneys in the general expense fund and each and every special fund
- ◇ He shall retain all orders of the Grand Knight as his vouchers

Sanger, Eugenics – A History Lesson Part 2

Last month we touched on the history of **Eugenics**, *the science of improving a human population by controlled breeding to increase the occurrence of desirable heritable characteristics*, and the historical part played by the Progressive movement and Planned Parenthood founder Margaret Sanger, a leading proponent of eugenics.

Margaret Sanger was born in 1879. She became a noted social activist, Socialist, sex educator, feminist, writer, and nurse working in the slums of Manhattan's Lower East Side and Brooklyn dealing first hand with poverty, immigrants, and rampant infant mortality. In order to combat the problems she saw in her work she embraced radical "solutions" advocating mass sterilization of "defectives," mass incarceration of "the unfit," and harsh immigration restrictions. She repeatedly referred to the lower classes as "human waste" and "weeds" that should be "exterminated." **The culture of death was an essential part of Margaret Sanger's philosophy and continues to be embraced through Planned Parenthood.**

In her writings, Margaret Sanger vehemently condemned charitable action. "Organized charity itself," she wrote, "is the symptom of a malignant social disease." It perpetuates a "constantly increasing number of defectives, delinquents, and dependents. My criticism, therefore, is not directed at the 'failure' of philanthropy, but rather at its success." Additionally, she intoned that "the most merciful thing that the large family does to one of its infant members is to kill it."

"Eventually," wrote Edwin Black, "America's eugenic movement spread to Germany as well, where it caught the fascination of Adolf Hitler. Under Hitler, eugenics careened beyond any American eugenicist's dream."

After WWII ended the word "eugenics" was no longer popular, but Margaret Sanger corresponding in 1953 on International Planned Parenthood Federation letterhead wrote "I appreciate that there is a difference of opinion as to what a Planned Parenthood Federation should want or aim to do, but I do not see how we could leave out of its aims some of the eugenic principles that are basically sound in constructing a decent civilization."

If you are unfamiliar with eugenics suggested reading would include Edward Black's "**War Against the Weak: Eugenics and America's Campaign to Create a Master Race**".
