In the Supreme Knight's Report to the 131st Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in 2013 he noted how the recently elected Pope had transfixed the world by his personal witness to charity. PRO-LIFE Message for February 2015

Sometimes when I compose these notes 30 plus days in advance the obvious escapes me, so I will mention it now. This January 22nd marked the 42nd year since the decision for Roe v. Wade was handed down by the Supreme Court, making abortion legal during the first trimester of pregnancy.

On that same day, the decision for Doe v. Bolton was also handed down by the same court, making abortion legal in our nation during all nine months of pregnancy. It always takes me awhile to wrap my thoughts around the fact 57 million unborn babies have been legally aborted, thus far, since those decisions and that date.

Of note, Rep. Mike Hill, District 2, has introduced HB 147 - Women's Health Protection Act requiring certain physicians - abortionists - to have admitting privileges at a hospital within 30 miles of the location where abortions are performed or induced. This is exciting news for Florida, especially in Jacksonville where not one of the abortionists at the three local abortion facilities has hospital admitting privileges.

Slowly, inexorably, year by year, the pro-life movement seems to be making headway in our culture. The increasingly widespread use of ultrasound machines has shown the humanity of the unborn child in an unmistakable way, and the peaceful, prayerful vigils outside abortion clinics has helped to save lives and change hearts, as we seek to build a Culture of Life respecting the dignity of every human life at every stage.

The Spring 40-Days for Life Campaign begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2015 and continues through to Palm Sunday on March 29, 2015. This year we will be standing once again in front of "A Woman's Choice of Jacksonville", at 4131 University Blvd. South (Seven days a week from 7 A.M. until 7 P.M.). The Jacksonville Local Director is Carol Rowell, 904-382-2619.
