SI-3	<p>Christology (Advanced Theology – The Creed) <i>Christianity stands on the person of Jesus Christ. Before Jesus uttered a single word or did a single act, God revealed in this man His will for us. Jesus' very existence as fully God and completely human, excluding sin, and how Jesus is a divine person whose divine and human natures harmoniously co-exist in a mutual relationship where one neither absorbs nor divides from the other, reveals how God wants to relate to us. Before Jesus utters a word or does a single act, His very existence is a revelation from God that we are called to be in a permanent, harmonious relationship with God. Jesus' earthly ministry, climaxing in His death and resurrection, made possible our ability to reconcile with God and become co-workers in bringing in the Kingdom of God.</i></p> <p><i>This understanding of Jesus Christ is the fruit of the study of person and mission of Jesus Christ: Christology. This has been a central focus of study for theology since the beginning of the Church. What we believe and argue today about whom Jesus is and what He did was earned through much prayer, thought and argument.
