

Lent: A Time to Plant and a Time to Grow Week 3— Planting Seeds of Change . . . To Grow A Mindset of Love

Too often we underestimate the power of a touch, a smile, a kind word, a listening ear, an honest compliment, or the smallest act of caring, all of which have the potential to turn a life around. Many times we don't act because we feel like we have to do big things and have it all figured out, which is like planting *boulders*. But if we just plant small seeds, God will make them grow (1 Corinthians 3:6-8). He knows how to change the world. Every action and every word plants something in every person's life.

So just what are *seeds of change*? Seeds are small but powerful. They are Smiles, Expressions, Encouragement, Donations, Serving. They can be planted generously with love, faith, and hope in our hearts . . . and without worry. We never know what type of hearts we are sowing love into (Mark 4:1-20). We don't know what type of pain, hurts, or heartaches are existing in the hearts and lives of others that we pass by. Remember, someone may have come by before me sowing seeds of God's love, and now I am watering. And perhaps these people we pass by will begin to see, feel, or recognize God's love and presence through these small seeds of kindness.

Seeds of Change can be planted everywhere we go. There are no accidents about where we are and who we are with, who we happen to be sitting next to, walking by, standing in line next to, etc. God does not waste one moment of our lives . . . everything and everyone is significant. He knows who needs love, a kind word, encouragement, and He places us next to them. Therefore, be intentional with every moment and every person. It's all in God's plan to love people everywhere. Make it part of your plan? Start planting now!

Blue Mass- To Honor the Work of All Public Safety Personnel

A little history about the Blue Mass- The first Blue Mass was celebrated on September 29, 1934 at St. Patrick Catholic Church in Washington, DC.. On that day, 1,100 police officers and firemen dressed in blue uniforms processed into St. Patrick's to honor the fallen members of their ranks. The Blue Mass began to spread to other cities in the northeastern United States from that day on. Following the events of 9/11, the Blue Mass began to be celebrated in cities from coast to coast to honor the many law enforcement officers, firefighters, and emergency medical personnel who gave their lives so that others might live. It is estimated that 25,000 people were saved on 9/11 as a result of their courage.

The Blue Mass allows us to remember not only the heroes of 9/11 but also the heroes in our own community, the women and men who put themselves in harm's way daily to serve, protect and defend us.

St. Joseph Parish is honored to recognize the extraordinary dedication of the public servants who quietly exemplify the noblest virtues of our faith. If you are or were involved n any facet of public safety as an–EMT, Nurse, Doctor, Fireperson, Police Personnel, 911 Responder or in any branch of the military, we invite you to join us for Mass on Saturday, April 27, at 5:30 p.m. All attendees will be recognized as a group for the work you perform and the dedication you show to your profession. 



Happy Feast Day to all St. Joseph Parishioners

A few facts about St. Joseph . . . Pope Pius IX proclaimed **Saint Joseph the patron** of the Universal Church in 1870. Having died in the "arms of Jesus and Mary" according to Catholic tradition, he is considered the model of the pious believer who receives grace at the moment of death, in other words, the **patron** of a happy death. His feast day is March 19.

Venerated as a **saint** in many Christian sects, **St. Joseph** is a biblical figure who is believed to have been the corporeal father

of Jesus Christ. According to the Bible, Joseph was born circa 100 B.C.E. and later wed the Virgin Mary, Jesus' mother. He died in Israel circa 1 A.D. According to cookbook author and chef Lidia Bastianich, on St. Joseph's Day, Italian tables are filled with fig dishes, including fig cookies. (St. Joseph also happens to be the patron saint of pastry chefs.) Zeppole or Sfinge — dough fritters covered in sugar — are also traditionally eaten on this day.
