Our Mission

The mission of St. Andrew School Advisory Council is to support excellence in Catholic education through sound fiscal planning, policy formation, and cooperation and communication with the parish community. The council contributes to informed decisions that support teaching, learning and school improvement.

The council also works to foster a meaningful and supportive relationship with the parish community. The Council functions as an advisory body to the Pastor and Principal. The mission of the Council is to support excellence in Catholic education through sound fiscal planning, to review and help formulate school policy, and to foster a meaningful and supportive relationship with the parish community.

The St. Andrew School Advisory Council is a representative body comprised of elected and appointed members whose primary responsibility is to advise the pastor and principal in the Catholic values, policy formation, strategic planning, financial and educational realms which govern the operation of the school.

Members of the Council must meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Display an interest in, and a commitment to, Catholic education and to the school's philosophy, mission and student learning expectations
- ✓ Be able to reach consensus and deal with situations as they relate to the good of the entire school community
- ✓ Be able and willing to attend school, Parish and Diocesan meetings, retreats and workshops
- ✓ Be able and willing to participate in committee work
- ✓ Maintain high levels of integrity and confidentiality
- ✓ Be a credible witness of the Catholic faith
- ✓ Be at least 18 years of age
