This coming week, my series on the Triduum begins. Understanding the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper will be held on Monday, 25 March, from 7-9 PM at ASP in the Activities Building. A handicapped entrance can be found on the Wilson Street side of the building. The same session will be held again on Tuesday, 26 March, from 1-3 PM at HSP in the cafeteria in the school building. You are welcome to come either in the afternoons or evenings, or if you're really crazy, BOTH! All you need to bring is yourself and perhaps some paper if you want to take some notes to remember it all. There is no pre-registration. Come and learn something about these important days in our Catholic lives.

Tomorrow, 25 March, brings a momentous moment for our parish grouping, a new website is going live! You can find it at www.EGMCatholic.org. Of course, that's short for Etna, Glenshaw, and Millvale Catholic. A small bit of history is necessary. The concept started in Millvale with their web domain contact expiring a few months back. The other Friday I received the four *On Mission for the Church Alive!* © capital campaign statements. I STILL need to learn more about what were in the original case statements and where we are with the completion of said projects. Anyway, as of 30 November 2018, the following funds/proceeds were deposited in each account: ASP \$5,716.54; SBP \$5,181.91; HSP \$1,620.06; and SNP \$438.00. If you are having trouble making your pledge payment, please let me know. None of these funds can be used for the compensation fund that will aid those who were abused by members of our diocesan clergy or for related legal expenses. Thanks to all for your continued generosity to the campaign.

Last Monday the Clergy Team had a meeting with our three Police Chiefs. It was a good starting point to improving the security of our buildings and the safety of our communities when we gather. The biggest take away was the use of 911. They all agreed that when ANYTHING suspicious is going on, do not hesitate to call 911. More to come.

We are always given the chance to turn from sin, through the sacrament of Reconciliation, and be recipients of God's great mercy and kindness. That is the first step in our transformation into the disciples of Jesus that bear fruit which we must become!
