✠ Eucharistic Adoration to Prepare for Lent ✠

St. Peter Parish is hosting seven days of 24 Hour Eucharistic Adoration, beginning Sunday, March 3, 2019 at noon and concluding with Benediction at 11:00a.m. on Saturday, March 9th. This is the week that transitions from Ordinary Time to Lent (Ash Wednesday is March 6th). All are welcome to hold vigil with the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel any hour during that week. Praying a Holy Hour in the presence of the Real Presence can be a beautiful way to prepare for your Lenten journey. Please find sign-up information at the table in the Church Narthex.

Lenten Regulations: Fasting and Abstinence

The Church's simple formula for observing Lent: almsgiving, prayer and fasting. These are the three things that we do to strengthen our relationship with the Lord and prepare for Easter.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence from meat for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Reconciliation, Benediction and Soup Supper

Join fellow parishioners for Stations of the Cross concluding with Benediction on Friday evenings at 6:00p.m. Confessions will be heard from 6:00 to 7:00p.m. A simple soup potluck will follow in the Parish Hall (with the exception of the Vocations Ministry Fish Fry Fundraiser to be held following Stations on March 8th and April 12th). Please bring a meatless soup to share for our parish soup suppers. Thank you.
