My dear Sisters and Brothers in Hispanic Ministry,

During this Lenten season we reflect in the time when Christ walked with his disciples, lived with them, ate with them, attended social events and gatherings, all of this as part of the relevant teaching Christ was imparting to his followers, knowing that the time to leave them was approaching and that they were going to need each other to continue the mission. Today, we utilize the scripture to tell us the basics of our ministry, to love one another, to walk together, to support and tolerate each other, to console the widow, to feed the hungry, to clothe the naked, to welcome the stranger, to protect the children. We all know this very well, but how well do we practice it? These were the same duties acknowledged and practiced by the first Christian communities. Pastoral Accompaniment has to do with, **Kerigma**, to proclaim the Good News and the mercy of God; **Didache**, teaching, focused on the works of mercy, justice, Christian leadership and faith; **Koinonía**, fomenting the formation of fraternal communities, where God is the center, and the solidarity to those who suffer, becomes the heart of our actions; and **Diaconia**, service driven by love, to our brothers and sisters in need, with the unconditional support of their faith community.

Let us meet then in Minnesota to take a look at the principles of our ministries, and to make a conscientious effort to stir the goals of our ministry in the right direction. I believe that the better we understand the "**Pastoral de Acompañamiento**" the better we will serve the Hispanic Catholics in our own dioceses.

I am looking forward to see all of you at our conference June 26-29, 2007 to learn and to journey together as one body, with joy and hope, the way God always intended.

REGION I

- The Archdiocese of Boston MA. hired Fr. Alonzo Maxias as the new Director for Hispanic Ministry.
- Region I had their Lent Retreat on March 6, at Saint Anne Shrine in Fiskdale, MA. The retreat was facilitated by Fr. Luigi Zanotto.
- Rudy Vargas, Executive Director of the Northeast will offer again, during this summer, opportunities of formation for this Region I. It will be through the Northeast Pastoral Institute. These courses will take place at Holy Apostles in Crowell, CT.
- The Diocese of Providence named the first Hispanic priest as Pastor of a parish (Assumption Parish-Providence). Fr. Gildardo Suarez came from the Diocese of Sonson Rionegro Medellin, Colombia to the US five years ago to serve in this diocese. Congratulations Fr. Gildardo!

REGION II

- The Conference for Diocesan Directors for Hispanic Ministry of Region II, decided at their last meeting, held November 7-9 of 2006, at Bon Secours Spiritual Center, Marriotsville, MD, not to conduct a meeting in the Fall, in order to facilitate the assistance of its members at the 7th Biannual Conference of NCADDHM which will take place in Minneapolis from the 26-29 of June 2007.
- The Northeast Hispanic Catholic Center announced that it will continue to serve the dioceses of the region through its Mobile Institutes which currently take place in various dioceses. Moreover, the School for Leadership which has been running for the past couple of months in the Archdiocese of New York, continues to develop, elevating enthusiasm and participation from students at a parish level as well as archdiocesan level.
- We received some last minute news that the Diocese of Rockville Center has elected Deacon Francisco Cales as the Coordinator for Hispanic Pastoral, substituting Deacon Manuel Ramos, who has retired. Further information will be provided during the next edition of the Newsletter.
- The Bishop of the Diocese of Brooklyn/Queens, Nicholas DiMarzio, decided to close the Office of Hispanic Ministry in the diocese. In a document published in January 2007, Bishop DiMarzio handed over the care of the Hispanic faithful to the recent ordained Bishop, Octavio Cisneros, who will execute the function of

Vicar for Hispanic Affairs. On the other hand, Bishop DiMarzio designated Father Fulgencio Gutierrez to work from the Office of Migration and Ethnic Apostolate with pastoral services on behalf of the Hispanic community.

Sonia Casanova, after many years servicing the Hispanic community, with ample participation in the regional and national organisms of Hispanic ministry, including NCADDHM, was discharged. We pray that her talents and experience would be put to good use soon in the service of our beloved Spanish speaking community.

REGION III

- Camden diocese is holding a workshop of formation for all clergy and pastoral ministers to promote the needs of the Hispanic apostolate on March 20. The day will be attended by surrounding dioceses, as well.
- The region is preparing to have representation attending the upcoming "National Joint Convocation on Small Christian Communities" that is sponsored by the USCCB Secretariat and affiliated groups at St. Thomas, St. Paul, MN, in August .

TORCH OF HOPE— *February 14, 2007*

The snow, ice freezing cold, blowing wind accompanied by pellets of frozen rain seemed to be conspiring to cancel the first anniversary celebration of a movement—begun here in Philadelphia! —on behalf of “Immigration Law Reform.” But they didn’t succeed!

“Guesstimates” of between 250-300 people gathered at 5th & Market Streets (Philadelphia) in the quietly powerful shadows cast by our “Independence Hall” and “Liberty Bell.” Their purpose—in the freezing weather which closed schools and businesses that day! —was to prayerfully and respectfully ask our legislators to address the accelerating need for more just and comprehensive reform of our immigration laws. The “numbers” attending might be dismissed as small and insignificant until we recall that each person present represented the millions of others asking our blessed country for the right to work toward citizenship while contributing to the richness of the U.S.A. at the same time. Our Catholic Bishops continue to ask us to “put a face” on the immigration issues that confront our country through their Justice for Immigrants Campaign. On February 14, 2007 many did just that —“put a face” on the issue”—in the freezing weather. For many of us, we should be able to see the face of Christ and the faces of our parents, grandparents, relatives in these dedicated individuals—not the faces of terrorists, drug-dealers or those who come to undermine the values of this country.

REGION IV

- **Oblate School of Theology continues its program for the Doctorate in Ministry with concentration on Hispanic Ministry.** Since the last time I wrote in this newsletter about my experience in the Doctorate program, two years ago, I have finished the classes and I am waiting for the approval of my proposal for the pastoral project that we need to accomplish before writing the thesis.
- One good fruit of the article was the enrollment of Fanny Tabares, Director of Hispanic Ministry in Kalamazoo, MI, and she is already half way through the program. I would like to invite you to check the School's website www.ost.edu and visit their information table at the Conference in Minneapolis this June.
- The NCADDHM Board meeting took place on February 12 – 15, 2007 in Atlanta, Georgia. It was the first meeting as president for Ms. Enid Roman de Jesus from the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend, IN. She guided the three-day-meeting with great leadership skills, which was much appreciated by all the members. There were also three new members on the Board: Ms. Fanny Tabares, from the Diocese of Kalamazoo, MI, Mr. Juan Lulio Blanchard, from the Archdiocese of New York, and myself Mrs. Maria Johnson from the Archdiocese of Baltimore. It was a pleasure to find out that from the eleven members present; there were nine different countries represented: Guatemala, USA, Puerto Rico, Spain, Peru, Colombia, Dominican Republic, Mexico and Nicaragua. It truly represents the diversity of our community, but most importantly, it means that our leadership is inclusive of the different nationalities gather that are represented under the term Hispanic or Latino. When a group of peers meet to work, discern, and pray together, there is always a sense of renewal and refreshment. I appreciated the personal sharing, though brief.

Several of the Diocesan Directors from the Region were present. Before the conference started, the Directors had their Regional meeting. One item on their agenda was the need for the Church to prepare for the possibility of our nation’s next legalization program. In collaboration with CLINIC, Diocesan Legalization Coordinators are being prepared and plans are being made. The group continued planning for their Annual Regional Encuentro for Hispanic Adults to be held this spring. Members were encouraged to attend the NCADDHM conference which will be held in our Region in June.

JOB OPENING

Diocesan Director for the Hispanic Apostolate

The Catholic Diocese of Richmond in Virginia is seeking a full-time Director for the Hispanic Apostolate. The selected individual will collaborate with the parishes and other diocesan offices in the evangelization, formation and training of Hispanics, calling them forth to service and leadership at all levels of the Church and community; promoting the recognition of Hispanic Catholics as integral to the full life of the Church; sustaining, celebrating and sharing the culture, values, language and spirituality of Hispanics with the Church and wider community. The candidate must be an active practicing Catholic, who has a commitment to the advancement of the Hispanic community; master's degree in a related field preferred; must be proficient in Spanish and English, written and spoken, and computer literate; leadership and organizational skills required, as well as administrative and pastoral experience working with Hispanics; and the ability to work with diverse groups of people.

Encuentro Partners' Meeting

A group of bishops and church leaders met on February, 2007 at MACC in San Antonio, Texas. The meeting was led by Bishop Jaime Soto of Orange County, CA and Bishop Placido Rodríguez of Lubbock, TX. Information Items included the restructuring of USCCB. Hispanics Affairs now became part of a cluster of multicultural ministry which is now called Cultural Diversity of the Church.

The First National Encuentro for Hispanic Youth and Young Adult Ministry analyzed and participants agreed with Fr. Virgilio Elizondo that leadership in organizations need to be faithful to the findings of Encuentro Process and allow for the Hispanic youth and young adults to have a continual voice. Rudy Vargas IV suggested to not loose sight of what the young people have said. "It is documented and this needs to guide us in what's the best way for us to respond". Some suggestions included:

- 1) Allow youth to have a voice in all levels of leadership,
- 2) Development of Leadership in Pastoral Youth/Young Adults,
- 3) Higher education attainment,
- 4) Immigration reform, and
- 5) dialogue between the youth and bishops.

Another issue that was discussed was Immigration. Prioritization of next steps were to: Formalize a National Partner's Group, create a 5 year strategic plan, hire a full-time person at national level to implement Encuentro, do a training model, and create deadlines.

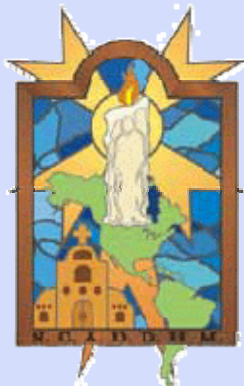

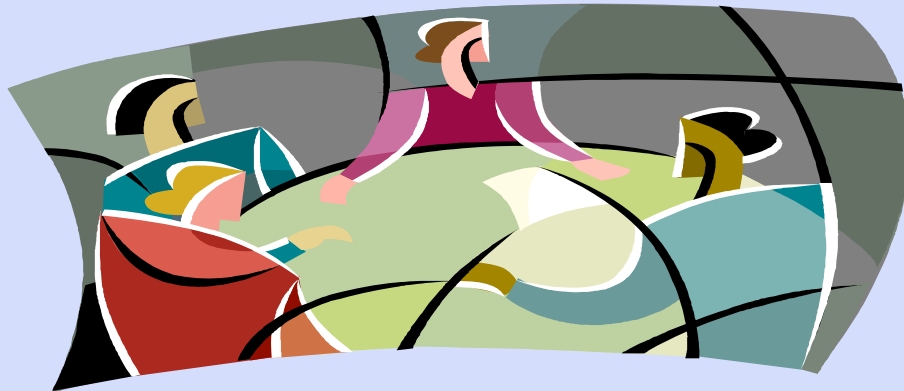
