THE HOLY SEASON OF LENT

Lent begins Wednesday, March 6th, with the distribution of Ashes during the 8:30 AM and 6:00 PM Masses. All are encouraged to attend one of these Masses.

Lenten Rice Bowls /Bishop's Appeal

The children of St. Joseph Parish will once again participate in the upcoming Catholic Relief Service Lenten Rice Bowl collection. (Lent begins in ten days).

The 2019 Bishop's Appeal to support Catholic Charities begins soon, the kick off weekend is March 9/10. At the same time, Catholic Relief Services runs the Lenten Rice Bowl, a way of collecting coins and loose change to address hunger issues among poor people. The Rice Bowl collections are taken up in little boxes especially fitted for coins. As was done last year, this effort is focused primarily on children as a way of sacrificing during Lent and helping others that are needier than themselves.

All the money collected will then be counted and added to the Bishop's Appeal since both funds go to Catholic Charities. Rice Bowl then becomes primarily a children's activity to help them participate in Lenten giving. Rice Bowls will be available at the back church next Sunday.
