The Paschal Compromise

The lateness of the date of this year's Easter has disoriented me a bit. How can it be Mothers Day already when I just put the bunnies away in the attic?! How did the month of May arrive so quickly? In that light I thought I would give us all a review of how we get our Easter date each year. It turns out to be a compromise between two very opinionated groups...

Early in Christianity there was a group of people known as the Quartodecimans who wanted Easter to be celebrated every year on the precise day of Jesus' historical Passover, the 14th of Nissan, the first day of the full moon that followed the Spring Equinox. This would mean that Easter would be on a weekday most of the time. Another group insisted that since Scripture states that Jesus rose after the Sabbath, the first day of the week, Easter should always be on a Sunday.

When the Council of Nicaea was called by Emperor Constantine in 325, the topic of establishing a date for Easter was on the agenda. After some ecclesial debating, a compromise was reached: the decision came down that Easter was to be celebrated on the Sunday following the first full moon of the Spring Equinox. Everyone accepted this decree except Britain and Ireland because of their own Celtic calendar, but nearly 350 years later, they, too, went along. Since then Easter can be officially celebrated any date from as early as March 23 to as late as April 25.
