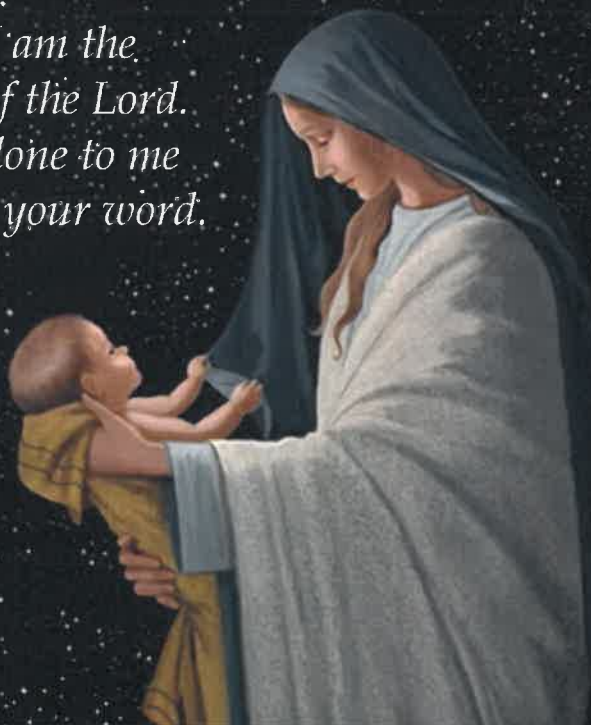

Blessed Advent!

This begins the 4th Sunday of Advent! Today all the candles (love, hope, joy and peace) are lit, but especially the last purple candle which symbolizes peace. My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Since Christmas is coming up fast, I am going to take a break from my explanations of the Creed for a short time. I would like to take this opportunity to write about (you guessed it) Christmas. There is no holiday that gets so much attention and, at the same time, so much neglect, at least for its actual purpose. At this time many have spent a significant amount of time decorating their homes and buying gifts for loved ones (I myself still have some Christmas shopping to do!). While we're busy trying to find the perfect gift for the best price, we must take some time to pause, remember, and reflect on what this holiday is really about: the birth of Jesus.

I want to share with you a beautiful experience I had several years ago. It was Christmas of 2011 and I was in Rome. I was given the opportunity to serve Midnight Mass at St. Peter's Basilica (Pope Benedict XVI was the celebrant). As I sat there in the basilica, I began to ponder a bit. Here we were in magnificent St. Peter's Basilica, celebrating the birth of Our Lord with a beautiful Mass, with thousands of people gathered and thousands more watching on TV. I then remembered that first Christmas, over two thousand years ago, when a poor virgin laid her newborn child in manger. So many in the world at the time, having seen this scene would have thought nothing of it, having no idea the magnitude and importance of that small child (except, of course, the shepherds who saw the angels). How simple was that first Christmas! And yet, how incredible. And here we were in Rome, celebrating with great joy that wonderful event: the birth of Our Savior and Redeemer.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, as we enter into the great feast of Christmas, let us never forget what we are celebrating. Enter into contemplation of this wonderful mystery and sing with the angels: "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."
