

In this week's Gospel, James and John, the sons of Zebedee and brothers, are trying to convince Jesus to put them into positions of power in heaven. Jesus explains that closeness to him comes from sharing in his suffering and in his servant leadership that comes from baptism. Leaders, in Jesus' world, come from humble service rather than positions of power.

- **What do you wish me to do for you? How would you answer Jesus?**
- **How do you define humility? What characteristics can we cultivate to lead us to greater humility individually and as Church?**
- **How committed are you to serving God's people? When and where can you serve?**
- **Who are some servant leaders you can identify with in our world?**
