

Unlike the readings of the past few weeks, in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus is approached by a man who simply asks what the greatest commandment is. Jesus replies with two lines from the Hebrew Scriptures. The first, from Deuteronomy 6:4, is the beginning of the Shema, the Jewish prayer of belief. You can hear the Shema [here](#). The second, to love our neighbor as ourselves is from Leviticus 19:18.

- In what ways is Jesus' vision of the world—where God is put first and our neighbors are loved—present here and now?
