In this Sunday's Gospel, taken from John, we hear Pontius Pilate question Jesus as to whether or not he is a king. Jesus responds that he is a king, but not of this world.

•What does the title “King” help us to understand about Jesus?

•What are the primary values of the Kingdom of God? How are they present in our world, our families, ourselves?
